Welcome to a new edition of our newsletter.

#### 1. New Myanmar Investment Law to go live on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017

The Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) announced yesterday that it will apply the new Myanmar Investment Law starting from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017 (<a href="http://tinyurl.com/zw9bqut">http://tinyurl.com/zw9bqut</a>). Proposals under the old Foreign Investment Law and the old Citizens Investment Law have to be submitted until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016. The old laws contain a mandatory five year corporate income tax exemption period. Investors wishing to profit from it have to submit their proposal until the end of this year.

It should be noted that the rules and regulations implementing the new Myanmar Investment Law are not out yet, so it is not clear yet how proposals have to be drafted after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2016.

Press reports had originally suggested that the new Myanmar Investment Law would go live on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017.

#### 2. Electricity

A floating power plant is to supply Yangon with electricity: A Turkish company launched a ship - which it calls the world's largest power plant - in Istanbul on 13<sup>th</sup> November 2016. It is expected to arrive in Yangon in April 2017.

The company, Karpowership, bid for a tender in July to supply electricity to Yangon for five years. Strictly speaking, Karpowership was not the tender winner, but was awarded a contract nevertheless as Myanmar Electric Power Generation Enterprise (EPGE) had underestimated the electricity demand when calling the tender.

The draft contracts are presently under review by authorities involved such as the Union Attorney General's Office.
