1. New Myanmar Investment Rules: Request for suggestions

DICA has uploaded a **briefing paper on the draft of the new Myanmar Investment Rules** (<u>http://tinyurl.com/jy4l6kx</u>). As part of the reform and Rules drafting process, **the MIC invites interested parties to submit their comments on**:

- Matters which need to be addressed during the transition period from where the new MIL has been enacted but the rules and regulations under the Myanmar Citizens Investment and Foreign Investment Rules are still in force pending adoption of the new Rules;
- feedback on issues affecting investors and stakeholders under the previous Myanmar Citizen Investment Law and Foreign Investment Law, including examples of practical difficulties faced by investors and suggestions of procedural improvements in relation to applications; and
- feedback on the priority areas which the new Rules will focus on as explained above.

Written submission in Myanmar or English may be made at any time, however, may not be considered if received **after 4pm on 16 December 2016**.

The MIC seems to try to avoid involving line ministries by drawing up an equivalent to present notification 26 - if an investment is not on this list, then the MIC will not have to seek approval of the ministry in charge before permitting or approving the investment. This article also states that investments below USD 5 million will in practice be approved by the state and regional governments instead of the MIC, and that the MIC is drafting "operating procedures" for the state and regional governments in an attempt to ensure uniform application of the new Myanmar Investment Law.

2. Crackdown on undocumented foreigners

As most readers are aware by now, the authorities are cracking down on undocumented foreigners. If you are a foreign national in Myanmar, are not staying at a hotel and have not obtained "form C" (this thing here: <u>http://tinyurl.com/zhzxt2j</u>), you should act immediately as you - seriously, this time - otherwise risk being arrested.

Real estate developers are apparently being asked to furnish employee rosters for construction sites.

3. Ministry of Commerce stops second-guessing prices in import/export license applications

By notification no. 74/2016 dated 22 November 2016, the Ministry of Commerce has announced that it will from now on accept the prices quoted in invoices and sales contracts that are submitted as part of the application file for an import/export license. Please find an English translation of the notification inside the newsletter.

It is to be hoped that the Ministry of Planning and Finance will follow suit and assess customs duty and commercial tax on the basis of the submitted prices instead of estimated prices. Importers and exporters are presently facing considerable uncertainty as it these estimates make it hard for them to calculate the amounts they have to pay at customs.

Ministry of Commerce Notification No. 74/2016

- CONVENIENCE TRANSLATION - ACCURACY NOT GUARANTEED -

Ministry of Commerce and Trade Minister's Office Notification No. 74/2016 8th Waning Day of Thazaung Mone 1378 (22 November 2016)

The Ministry of Commerce and Trade issues, with the consent of the Union Government, this notification according to the authority conferred upon it by section 13, sub-section (b) Import/Export Law.

Notification relating to the approval and issuance of import/export licenses

- (1) In order to enable fast and smooth trade and trading business that complies with the law, the Ministry of Commerce and Trade will, with regard to an import/export license, not scrutinize the price, and approve the license based on the price and values in the invoice and the sales contract submitted by companies in good faith together with an undertaking stating that the price and the value are true.
- (2) The following items have to be submitted when applying for an import/export license.
 - (a) Online import/export license application (revenue-stamped with Ks. 600) [*Translator's note: It says "online" and "revenue-stamped" in the original.*]
 - (b) Original invoice
 - (c) Original sales contract
 - (d) Undertaking that the description, price and values contained in the invoice and sales contract are true
 - (e) Recommendation from the relevant departments (for goods that are to be imported/exported where a recommendation is required)
- (3) The scrutinizing, value assessment and collection of tax for the import/export license/permit approved in this way on the basis of the value in the invoice shall be done according to the law, rule, order, procedure, principles and directives of the Ministry of Planning and Finance.

- (4) Action shall be taken, according to the law, rule, order, procedure and directives of the relevant department in force, against companies which fake the invoice or sales contract or illegally falsify the description in the invoice or sales contract or alter the price or values in the invoice or sales contract in order to avoid tax.
- (5) If necessary, the relevant departments may re-scrutinize, according to international procedures, the prices in the approved licenses after approval and issuance of the licenses on the basis of the prices in the invoice or sales contract together with the undertaking.
