Welcome to a new edition of our newsletter.

1. Draft of a "Law Relating to Petroleum Exploration, Drilling and Production" published

In anticipation of a new bidding round, expected to be held in the first half of 2019 (<u>https://tinyurl.com/y8rhrzgq</u>), the Ministry of Electricity and Energy published the draft of a "Law Relating to Petroleum Exploration, Drilling and Production" in the Myanmar Gazette on 2 October 2018.

If enacted, the law will govern exploration, drilling and production in addition to the production sharing contract or improved petroleum recovery contract that successful bidders will have to conclude with Myanma Oil and Gas Enterprise ("**MOGE**"). Currently, there is not much of a legal framework for such activities; they are almost exclusively governed by the contract with MOGE.

The government encourages local companies to register with the Ministry of Electricity and Energy and find a foreign partner for a joint investment (<u>https://tinyurl.com/ybd68rku</u>). Differently from the 2013 bidding round, however, foreign investors will not be required to form a joint venture in order to be able to bid.

2. Union Tax Law 2018/2019

The Union Tax Law 2018/2019 (Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Law No. 32/2018) was enacted on 25 September 2018. It took effect for state-owned enterprises on 1 October 2018 and will take effect for private enterprises on 1 April 2019. An English translation is available to our premium subscribers. The main changes are as follows:

- Private enterprises may have to adopt a new financial year (from 1 October to 30 September) on 1 October 2019;
- cigarettes, cheroots and liquor (except beer and wine) will become more expensive due to a hefty increase of the special goods tax;
- raw and processed diamonds and emeralds and jewellery made thereof will be exempt from special goods tax;

The background is that - apparently following a Supreme Court judgment - individual labour disputes are no longer heard by the nationwide arbitration system composed of a township-level conciliation body, an arbitration body in each Region and State and a Union-level arbitration council. Reportedly, collective labour cases are no longer accepted as well.

This means that labour disputes have to be resolved by the ordinary courts which, in practice, puts employees at a disadvantage as employers would usually be better equipped to deal with lengthy procedures.

At least in Yangon Region, however, it is also possible for aggrieved employees to file a complaint with the Regional government (in both individual and collective cases) - which we have recently done on behalf of a foreign employee. We are not sure of the legal basis, though, as the Settlement of Labour Dispute Law does not provide for such an alternative system.
