#### THE NATIONAL SERVICE LAW: OVERVIEW



### **History**

- <u>1959 National Service Act</u>, never activated
- Replaced by <u>2010 National Service Law</u>, activated on <u>10.2.2024</u>
- Central Body for Drafting National Servicepersons established on <u>13.2.2024</u>
- <u>Region/State</u> and <u>Nay Pyi Taw Council</u> Bodies for drafting National Servicepersons established on 14.2.2024



### **History**

- Drive to brief township, ward and village administrations started on or around 16.2.2024 (<u>example</u>)
- District and Township Bodies for Drafting National Service Persons established on <u>22.2.2024</u>
- Various working groups established on <u>24. and 25.2.2024</u>
- As of <u>5.3.2024</u>, the relevant working group has drafted Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and the third draft of National Service Rules (neither are in the public domain)



#### **History**

- National Service Rules reportedly in the final review stage, and matters that may be carried out in advance were notified to the Region and State Bodies for Drafting National Servicepersons (<u>source</u>)
- Official registration of potential recruits started in "almost all Regions and States" on or before <u>16.3.2024</u>


#### Enquiries welcomed for People's Military Service Law

### **Scope and timeline**

- "Start roughly after Thingyan" (<u>Source</u>)
- "More than 6.3 million men and 7.7 million women of military age, only 1 in 200 to serve" (<u>Source</u>)
- "More than 60,000 villages and wards; not more than one or two persons per village and ward expected to serve" (<u>Source</u>)
- "Batches of 5,000 per month to be summoned for national service" (<u>Source</u>)



### **Scope and timeline**

- "50,000 to serve per year" (<u>Source</u>)
- "Currently no plan to draft women" (<u>Source</u>)
- "No restrictions on renewal of passports and departures abroad" (<u>Source</u>)
- However, recommendation letter from ward office or police now required for domestic travel by bus (<u>source</u>)



#### THE NATIONAL SERVICE LAW IN DETAIL



### **Targeted age groups**

- Men: 18-35 years
- Women: 18-27 years
- Male experts: 18-45 years
- Female experts: 18-35 years

("Expert" = medical doctor, engineer, person with a technical education, or professional with any other skill)

(Only citizens are targeted according to section 2 (a))



## Length of service

- Ordinary recruits: Up to 2 years
- Experts and "Defence Services technicians": Up to 3 years
- "If there is a state of emergency in the Union": Up to 5 years

("Defence Services technician" = technician among the personnel serving in the Armed Forces whose expertise is included in the grouping table as specified by order of the Defence Department Council)



### **List compilation**

- Section 8: Ward and Village Tract "Peace and Development Councils" (now: "Administrators") to compile and send lists of residents of military age to the relevant Township Body for Drafting National Servicepersons "by 1st January every year"
- List compilation has started, but not clear yet how complete and comprehensive the lists are
- Data may be from household lists, guest lists, census data kept by the Department of Immigration and Population, and door-to-door collection



### **Drafting process**

**Drafting process consists of three distinct steps:** 

- (i) Summoning for registration
- (ii) Summoning for medical examination
- (iii) Summoning for national service



### Registration

- Township Body for Drafting National Servicepersons to summon "all citizens of military service age" (section 9 (a)) for registration
- Registration seems to have officially started in "almost all Regions and States" on or before <u>16.3.2024</u> by Ward and Village Tract Administrators delivering summonses and <u>sending out registration forms</u> to those who are covered by the law
- Still unclear whether this registration drive really covers "all citizens" or only some per ward or village tract



#### **Registration**

- Registered citizens should get a registration certificate (section 9 (a))
- Registered citizens are apparently told to notify ward and village tract authorities if they want to travel, to avoid "delays in the medical examination" (<u>source</u>)



### **Registration: Important for workers/students**

The following was apparently conveyed to industrial zone executives and CMP entrepreneurs in a meeting with officials on 15.3.2024 (<u>source</u>):

- Workers and students are not drafted with priority
- Workers travelling during Thingyan should take employee cards, social security cards and NRCs with them, plus ward recommendation letter to prove their address in Yangon and a letter from the company (<u>sample</u>)



### **Medical examination**

- Township Body may summon registered persons for medical examination by Defence Services Medical Examination Board (section 9 (b))
- Apparently, Township Bodies are to send registration files through District and Regional/State Bodies to the Central Body which will select candidates and send the files of those picked step-by-step back to the Township Bodies. Township Bodies are then to summon those selected for medical examination (<u>source</u>).



### **Summoning for national service**

- Township Body may summon "for national service" (section 10 (a)) citizens who (i) are registered and (ii) have undergone medical examination
- In analogy to the apparent process for selecting candidates for medical examination, we assume that the Township Bodies will send the files of those who passed medical examination step-by-step to the Central Body which will make a selection and step-by-step send back the relevant files.



### **Summoning for national service**

- <u>The plan seems to be</u> to select for national service those who ticked "want to be drafted with priority" in the registration form and fill remaining vacancies by drawing lots
- "For national service": "Trainees shall serve in the geographical area of their choice after the completion of their training period" (SAC spokesperson Maj.-Gen. Zaw Min Tun in an interview with Channel News Independent 14.2.2024)



### **Exemptions**

- Buddhist, Christian and Hindu clerics (Muslims not mentioned)
- Married women (including divorced women with children)
- Persons with permanent disability in any limb
- Persons determined by the Defence Services Medical Examination Board to be permanently unfit
- Persons exempted by an order of the Central Body for Drafting National Servicepersons



### Deferments

- Persons determined by the Defence Services Medical Examination Board to be temporarily unfit
- Civil servants
- Students
- Persons taking care of otherwise helpless parents
- Persons under drug rehabilitation
- Persons serving prison terms



### Deferments

## **Procedure for being exempted or deferred**

- Section 12 (a) National Service Law: Point of time to apply for exemption or deferment apparently when Township Body summons a person for military service (i.e., only after (i) registration and (ii) medical examination)
- Application to be filed with Township Body with evidence
- Application to be reviewed by Township Body, District Body, Region/State Body, and Central Body
- Central Body to decide



### **No loss of employment**

- Employers obliged to re-employ employees after they completed their national service in the same or similar position
- Establishment of a "Body for the Re-Employment of National Servicepersons" on <u>25.2.2024</u>
- National servicepersons are paid by the Union; employers not obliged to pay salary during national service. However, employers are obliged to pay "60 days of wages as a special right" (section 3 (c) <u>Payment of Wages Law</u>).



### **Mobilisation**

- If there is a "state of emergency for the national defence and security in all or parts of the Union," the Union Government may issue a mobilisation order for the appropriate region to all or some persons of military age and all or some persons having completed national service
- "Enemy" according to the definition in section 3 (n) <u>Defence Services Act 1959</u>: Includes armed mutineers, armed rebels, armed rioters, pirates and any person in arms against whom it is the duty of a person subject to military law to act



#### Offences

Various offences with punishments from up to 1 to up to 5 years imprisonment



#### **RESERVE FORCES LAW**



#### **Reserve Forces Law**

- State Peace and Development Council Law No. 28/2010 dated 4.11.2010
- Activated by the SAC on 13.2.2024
- Makes it compulsory for veterans who left the Defence Services to rejoin them if they are called to do so within 5 years after their resignation or retirement



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
